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**Firearms Simulator**

The U.S. Probation Office, Northern District of Georgia, is seeking vendors to submit quotes for a firearms simulator.

**1.0 INTRODUCTION:**

The U.S. Probation Office for the Northern District of Georgia requires interactive law enforcement training equipment, software and instruction. The equipment, software and instruction will be used to provide training to federal probation officers in the areas of Officer Safety and Firearms and enable us to address concerns related to the use of lethal and non-lethal force.

**2.0 OBJECTIVES:**

The ability to:

- have a training system specifically designed to help trainers create a fully integrated interactive curriculum;
- have a versatile training tool with the ability to change as circumstances and needs change to adapt to future policy and procedural changes;
- create additional scenario training videos specific to our District, as well as the ability to share and exchange training scenarios among Federal Probation Offices nationwide who use the same system or compatible system;
- incorporate equipment that Probation Officers use in the field and in firearms training, such as flashlights, OC and the LTR-III-PPSO targets;
- move around freely in a training environment.

**3.0 SCOPE**

Contractor provided interactive firearms training and testing equipment, software and instruction for the U.S. Probation Office for the Northern District of Georgia.

- A. The training system, equipment and software required is listed below in section 3.0 of this proposal.

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1. The training system must include the following:

- MS Windows 10 OS
- HD Projector (1920 x 1080) 2800 + lumens high contrast
- HD Projection fast fold projection Screen (12' x 7')
- 16-device Hit Detection Box with flashlight option
- Calibration Wand
- Auto-Calibration Feature
- All Power and Video Cables, to include power strip
- 22" Touch screen LCD Flat Panel Monitor
- Wireless Keyboard and Optical Mouse
- Speakers Digital Audio Sound System
- Transport Cases for System and Peripheral Items
- 850+ Multi-Branching Interactive Scenarios (pre-loaded) as well as 60+ Skill Builders

2. Software that allows for editing. The software must be capable in creating lessons, test and presentations for classrooms, auditoriums and training rooms. It must allow the user to utilize both digital video and computer graphics capabilities to create fully interactive training videos and/or graphics based on training environments and must include an HD digital video camera.

3. The training system must arrive, at delivery, with no less than twenty-five (25) scenarios that are "mission specific" to the day to day functions of a U.S. Probation Officer. If these scenarios are not available at delivery time, the vendor awarded the contract must film and edit these scenarios at their cost. Scenario completion date is sixty (60) days after the award date.

4. Laser Training Devices must include Laser modified OC spray training devices for less than lethal training applications. Trigger activation.

5. The training system must allow for "Low Light" training which will allow the trainee to use a real flashlight in conjunction with his/her weapon and must be non-lane based, thus allowing for multiple users. Flashlights with Infrared Lens should be included.

6. Targets must be included to allow the trainee to utilize the Course of Fire, Marksmanship, Shoot House, Basic Targets and Range Practice. Contractor must be willing and capable of digitizing Probation's current marksmanship programs and provide those as part of the package, at no additional cost.

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7. Knowledge Base must allow for utilization of custom multi-media for reinforcement of policy, procedures and learning objectives.
8. Statistics and Management capability must allow for the user to manipulate the database information to create individual and/or group statistics using relevant filtering criteria.
9. Baton Branching and Scoring which must allow for the trainer to manually branch the scenario while the trainee uses his/her actual baton or makes a strike. The system must be able to branch and score the use of action as a baton strike or strike.
10. The proposal must include the additional cost of the following training products:
  - Laser OC Canister
  - Flashlight with Infrared Filter
  - 4 Pistol Air Recoil Drop-In Kits - 2 for Glock Model 22 and 2 for Glock Model 23; specifics to be included must be set out
  - 1 "extra" CO2 magazine (tether less model) for each pistol (4 total magazines).
  - Trainee action capture that will allow for the recording of a trainee's actions/ reactions during scenario with playback inserted into the debrief scenario with PIP format; and the ability for this debrief format to be saved to the hard drive or other media for documentation proposed.

**Instruction**

1. Contractor shall provide training instruction on the use of the equipment and software for at least four (4) Probation employees, preferably presented locally in Atlanta, Georgia at the U.S. Probation Office. If other training instruction is offered, it must be so stated.
2. Length of course must be set out and should, at a minimum, cover set up of the equipment, calibration, planning scenarios, and filming and editing of scenarios.
3. At least two (2) hard printed copies of the Training Manual must be provided as well as two (2) electronic copies.

Contractor shall provide and honor their standard commercial warranty for all equipment and software purchased. A five-year warranty is preferred, and the details of the warranty must be submitted.
